Joan Rullman shared her recipe:

15 Bean Soup

I pretty much follow the recipe on the bag of 13 bean soup

Chop <u>1 med. onion, 2 stalks of celery and 2 carrots</u> (I often do carrots in the food processor) (Use the amounts that you would like.)

I do the quick soak method of softening the beans.

I, also, had a <u>REAL ham bone</u> for the soup and I feel that 'makes' the soup's flavor.

*I added 1 can each of Bush chili beans & Bush white beans because I didn't think I had enough volume ;Hence 15 bean soup)

to that I added vegetable broth.

Add 2 Bay leaves & 1 or 2 small packages of chopped smoked ham pieces.

Stir in: 1 or 2 TB of BETTER THAN BOUILLON - BAKED HAM BASE.

Simmer all together until the beans are soft.

Remove bone - cut out any good meat left on the bone. Taste and season as you feel is 'just right'!

As you see, I kind of makeup and add what I think will be tasty...I like to create a pot of something good.

1 lb Hamburger, browned

14 oz can crush tomatoes

20 oz can tomato soup

10 oz tomato juice

1 qt water

½ uncooked rice, NOT instant

1/4 cup beef base "Better Than Bouillon"

2 ½ cups green peppers, cubed

1 1/2 cups chopped onion

¼ t. pepper

1/4 t. garlic powder

1 t sugar

Bring to a boil, simmer 1hr.

Add ½ cup cooking sherry Enjoy!!!
